## **ABOUT THE CONFERENCE**

**IAMCR conferences** address a wide diversity of topics defined by our 29 thematic sections and working groups. We also propose a single central theme to be explored throughout the conference with the aim of generating and exploring multiple perspectives on a shared set of issues. This is accomplished through plenaries and special sessions, and in the meetings of the sections and working groups. For IAMCR 2019, the central theme is **Communication, Technology, and Human Dignity: Disputed Rights, Contested Truths.** 

The 2019 IAMCR Conference focuses around the role of communication in fulfilling the Preamble of the Paris Declaration (UN, 1948), which states that "recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world". This congress will feature analysis of the impact of the latest communication technologies on culture, human rights and social issues in the context of the so-called Post-truth era.

The Conference will examine the increasingly rapid advances in communication technology and the impact of these advances on the improvement of human and social quality of life. We will discuss issues such as the use of algorithms in the decision-making process in multiple fields of activity, the automation of professional, political and even judicial processes to the detriment of human input; data-mining and Big Data analysis of our on- and offline activities; the Internet of Things which, while opening new horizons for corporations, also permits greater government surveillance of private individuals; the development of intelligent machines poses new questions about what makes us human.

Also, the Conference will examine how new communication methods and technologies are diminishing the influence of objective facts in shaping public opinion and are increasing the appeal to emotions. If "everything becomes true on the Internet" (John Diamond), fake news becomes the norm, and messages and the media may become disconnected from the reality of people's lives.

During 2019 IAMCR Conference, we will explore the geopolitical and socio-economic effects of the changes in the structure of communication. The pre-eminence of the nation-state as the basic organizational unit in politics is coming under increasing pressure across the globe because of internal divisions and conflicts, increased fluxes of migrants, refugees and displaced persons, and widening income and wealth inequalities.

Bearing in mind their pivotal role in the organization of contemporary economic, political and social life, the digital media are undergoing profound organizational changes that lie at the heart of contemporary struggles between technologies and territories. The digital media are emerging

as the central cultural scenario in which the battles over freedom of expression and other contested rights are waged.

In summary, conflicts are intensifying around the rights of minorities, guarantees of personal freedom and full access to the entitlements of citizenship. At the same time, struggles are growing over the ownership and control of personal digital data, the circulation of 'fake' news, and the implications of robotics.

These trends raise urgent questions in respect of individual and social rights. How can communication remain human despite

the increasingly technological nature of the media and the turbulence of geopolitical systems? How can we define and reflect on our personal and social identities at a time when emerging technologies and other factors are challenging the established notion of "belonging to a nation"?

We are facing, then, clear threats to the quality of communication and to the quality of human life and dignity, which may be analyzed using the broad array of theoretical, technical and methodological approaches represented by the Sections and Working Groups of the IAMCR.

## **OPENING CEREMONY - CRYSTAL GALLERY (CIBELES PALACE)**



Located within Cibeles Palace, home to Madrid City Hall, this large courtyard, which is covered with an immense glass dome, hosts all kinds of public and private events.

The gallery is a multifunctional space covering an area of 2,800 square meters, enclosed by means of a sophisticated glass structure comprising over 2,000 glass triangles, all different from one another, at a height of 30 meters. In the 17th Century, it was

part of the area surrounding Buen Retiro Palace, and later, in the 19th Century, it housed a recreational garden. In the 20th Century, it became part of the Comunicaciones Palace, as an unloading passage and yard, and following its restoration and renovation, it has been turned into an essential element of Madrid City Hall.

This space is open to the public every day of the week, and has underfloor heating and air conditioning.

## SPECIAL VISIT: THYSSEN-BORNEMISZA MUSEUM



The Thyssen-Bornemisza collection shines particularly brightly in areas which are under-represented in other Spanish museums. Two paintings from the Trecento (Italian 14th century), Christ and the Samaritan Woman by Duccio di Buoninsegna and The Annunciation Diptych grisaille by Early Netherlandish painter Jan Van Eyck, are the museum's finest examples of late medieval art. The museum also houses an exquisite collection of 15th century portraits, including one of Giovanna Tornabuoni by


Ghirlandaio and one of Young Knight in a Landscape by Carpaccio. Works by Dürer, Caravaggio, Rubens, Frans Hals and Canaletto help us trace the trajectory of European art between the 16th and 18th centuries.

A visit to the museum offers a wonderful opportunity to study both landscape and genre art, two types of paintings that were particularly popular in the Dutch school of the 17th century and amongst 19th-century American artists. These paintings also inspired Romantic painters, such as Friedrich, Impressionists like Monet and Degas, and Post-Impressionists, like Gauguin and Van Gogh, all of whom are represented in the museum's collection.

The museum's ground floor houses a comprehensive collection of 20th century avant-garde works encompassing Fauvism, Expressionism, Surrealism and Abstract and Pop Art. Harlequin with a Mirror by Picasso, Kandinsky's Picture with Three Spots No. 196, Dali's Dream caused by the Flight of a Bee around a Pomegranate a Second before Waking up, The Cock by Chagall, Hotel Room by Hopper and Roy Lichtenstein's Woman in Bath are just a few of the masterpieces on display.

#### UNIVERSIDAD COMPLUTENSE DE MADRID

We would like to introduce you to the Complutense University, which will host the IAMCR 2019 conference. Founded in 1499, it owes its name to the ancient Roman city of Complutum dating from the first century B.C. (today Alcalá de Henares), where the first foundation stone of the University was laid. Many distinguished artists, politicians and scientists have passed through its halls, including several Nobel Prize winners.

It is a widely recognized and long standing institution, which sets out to impart educational courses of the highest order. The teaching quality and the courses offered carry an authentic "Complutense stamp".

One of the University's priorities is to consolidate its relationships with society and the world of production. The strength of its research departments has meant that many of them occupy positions of international leadership, the aim of the University in this field being "to develop centers of excellence based on large, quality networks, to promote emerging groups and to integrate young researchers" by linking research to teaching at graduate and postgraduate levels.

Its principles as an institution are "democracy, transparency, sustainability of the campus, real and virtual accessibility, preservation of the environment and social and economic commitment".

There are also several other Universities, museums and similar institutions within the Campus and near the School, which complement the overall academic experience. The University is set in an area of natural beauty on the western outskirts of the city.

The School occupies two buildings, which include the library, radio and television studios, audiovisual and computer laboratories, and, of course, the restaurant/cafeteria. The School has its own advertising agency, a school of production and its own communication media such as radio, press and digital media. Student life centers round a number of different associations, activity groups and the sports clubs.

The joint work of graduate, postgraduate and doctoral research groups with other departments of the University promotes the extension of projects and activities related to research in the field of Communication.

The proximity of the School to the center of Madid and the fact that various means of transport are readily available mean that, between sessions, it is possible to carry out a variety of cultural activities such as visits to the city's museums and landmarks; the School is also close to various accommodation options, including many on-campus Halls of Residence which offer accommodation at a very short distance from the School.

## SPANISH SUMMER CUISINE

Spain is outstanding for its cuisine, and during the summer our capital city is no exception. Here are some dishes to be enjoyed in Madrid during this time:

## Tortilla de patatas

Nobody who visits Spain should leave without having enjoyed this simple and delicious potato and onion omelette.

## Gazpacho

This cold cream soup is probably the most popular choice in Spanish cuisine during the hot months. There are a lot of variations, but the staple ingredients are tomatoes, onions and green peppers; and it is usually served with a sprinkling of finely cut cured ham and hard-boiled egg. Delicious, healthy and perfect to beat the heat.

## Salmorejo

Often confused with gazpacho, it is also a cold vegetable cream, the main difference with gazpacho being the addition of bread crumbs, which, along with the tomatoes, make it a thicker cream. Another great option to stay cool during the hot days (and evenings) of summer.

#### Croquetas

These breaded and fried croquettes, with different ingredients ranging from ham to chicken or vegetables are typical all year round; another typical dish to try.

### Cured ham – jamón serrano

The most typical and popular cold meat both in Spain and abroad. Another showpiece of our cuisine.

#### Cheese

The variety of different Spanish cheeses is as great as the number of regions they come from. Probably the best known are the Manchego cheeses in their many varieties. But there are also great cheeses from Asturias, the Basque country, the region of Galicia and many others.

#### Paella

Famous the world over, paella in any of its varieties (valenciana, mixta, veggie, etc.) is a must-have before you leave the capital.



### TRANSPORT IN MADRID

Madrid has a quality public transport system, which is conscious of and concerned with environmental issues and the quality of the air the citizens breathe.

#### **TICKETS**

The tickets are equally valid for the buses, the subway (Metro) and the light railways (tramways).

The single trip ticket in Zone A: Price 1.50€

- Some restrictions/supplements may apply
- The flat rate for the bus to/from the airport is 5.00€
- The 10 trip ticket in Zone A: price 12.20€.
- Some restrictions/supplements may apply

The Tourist ticket: unlimited bus/metro/tramway travel in Zone A during the validity of the ticket (children under 11 are entitled to a 50% discount on this ticket)

At all Metro Madrid network stations and when you board the bus (for a single trip).

Discounts may be available for large families and handicapped persons.

- The nearest Metro station to the conference is Cuidad Universitaria (Line 6 color grey). Madrid is a safe city, as is the Metro system. The network can be used at all times without worries, but it's just as well to keep an eye on your belongings.
- The 200-odd bus lines which cover the city are open between 6.30a.m. and 11.30p.m. (approximately). "Night Owl" buses run from 11.30p.m. to 5.50a.m.

### GETTING AROUND MADRID BY TAXI, BIKE, CAR SHARING & ELECTRIC MOPEDS

Madrid is an ideal city to explore on foot, but if you're in a hurry or located far from the campus, there are many options for getting around: subway, bus, bike, mopeds, electric cars, taxi or Uber.

#### Taxi

Madrid taxis are PSVs (public service vehicles), charging standard rates; unlike some other cities, they can be stopped in the street or boarded at a taxi rank.

Taxis to and from the airport: flat rate 30€.

You can also call a taxi by phone to come pick you up; in this case, you will almost certainly be charged from the moment the driver receives the call.

To use the bikes you have to be signed up (you will need your passport number) and have a bike card. You can do this at the totem on the bike parking lots. Payment must always be made by credit/debit card.

#### MoBike, THE ORANGE BIKES

These are conventional bikes (i.e. not electric) and they can be found in many different places all over the city. It is not necessary to collect them and drop them off at any particular place. You need to download the app to your cell phone and from then on, all operations (search, reservation, unlocking, payment, return) are made by phone. https://mobike.com/es/

### **ELECTRIC CAR RENTAL (Car Sharing)**

Another way of getting around Madrid which is becoming increasingly popular is Electric Car Rental. It is probably not the best option if you're not familiar with the city; but in case anyone wants to give it a try, the following companies rent these vehicles. Most of them limit the use of the cars to the area within the M30 ring road.
